STATE OF SOUTH CAROLINA.

WHEREAS, a careful survey of the City of Laurens, South Carolina, establishes a need for further sanitary sewers, in order that waste may be disposed of without undue hazard to the public health of the City; and

WHEREAS, such survey indicates that an expenditure of Four Hundred Fifty One Thousand and no/100 (\$451,000.00) Dollars will be required in order to provide sufficient collector sewer mains for that purpose; and One Hundred Fifty Thousand and no/100 to Two Hundred Thousand and no/100 Dollars of this total will be available for such purpose, leaving a balance of not over Three Hundred Thousand and no/100 (\$300,000.00) Dollars to be raised; and

WHEREAS, in the opinion of the Commissioners of Public Works such a program can and should be financed through the means of a monthly sewer charge of \$1.00 for each sewer connection inside City Limits of Laurens and a monthly charge of \$2.00 be made for connections outside City of Laurens. This charge to become effective July 1st. 1959, and

WHEREAS, such charge should be imposed on all users notwithstanding that the present collector system has been paid for from the proceeds of general obligation bonds,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF PUBLIC WORKS OF THE CITY OF LAURENS: That a construction program of collector sewer mains shall be instituted in order to provide a means of disposing of waste throughout all parts of the City of Laurens where health conditions require the same, at a cost of not exceeding Four Hundred Fifty One Thousand and no/100 (\$451,000.00) Dollars.

RESOLVED FURTHER: That such sum of Three Hundred Thousand and no/100 (\$300,000.00) Dollars be raised through means of an issue of Utility Revenue Bonds, but that the debt service be provided in part by a monthly charge for sewer service as set forth in the preambles hereof.

RESOLVED FURTHER: That a certified copy of this Resolution be forwarded to the Mayor and City Council of the City of Laurens for action on the part of that body.
