REGULAR MEETING
APRIL 17, 1990
6:30 P.M.

Members present: Mayor Dominick; Councilmembers Bolt, Franks, Griffin, Miller, Robertson, and Taylor.

Staff present: City Attorney Saunders, City Administrator Thomas, and City Clerk Beeks.

The press was notified of this meeting by mailed agendas.

Mayor Dominick called thge meeting ot order at 6:30 P.M. with Ms. Miller giving the invocation.

On a motion to approve the minutes of the March 20, 1990 meeting by Mr. Griffin, second by Mr. Robertson, all members voting aye.

Mayor Dominick then presented outgoing Councilmember Jimmy Franks with a key to the City, in honor of his years of service. Mr. Franks commented he was proud of the progress the City has made in the last twelve years.

On a motion to adjourn at 6:36 P.M. by Ms. Miller.

The City Clerk then conducted the ceremony swearing in the Mayor, Councilmembers, and CPW Commissioner.

At 7:00 P.M. the Mayor called the newly constituted Council to order.

Members present: Mayor Dominick; Councilmembers Bolt, Griffin, Henderson, Miller, Robertson and Taylor.

On a motion to nominate Mr. Bolt as Mayor-Pro-Tem by Mr. Taylor second by Mr. Henderson, all members voting aye.

The City Administrator commented that prior second reading of Ordinance # 02-90, a public hearing was advertised and held. This occurred on April 5, 1990 and no one attended.

On a motion to dispense with the reading of Ordinance 02-90, closing a section of Brooklyn Street and delivering a quit claim to the owner of the adjacent property in return for other property, by Mr. Bolt, second by Mr. Robertson, all members voting aye.

On a motion to give second reading to Ordinance 02-90 by Mr. Bolt, second by Mr. Griffin, all members voting aye.

The City Administrator then updated Council members on a revised version of the County Fire Ordinance saying that the latest proposal was much more agreeable. It would allow each fire department to negotiate for a millage to be set for the district and have a 7-10 member county wide board. Since the new board would not be constituted until July, the City would have to negotiate a one year

contract with the county. A multi-year contract could be negotiated with the board in succeeding years.

The County is also ready to move ahead on E-911 and is requesting \$50,000 for a contingency fee to be used in the event everything can't be subscriber-billed. The PSC will hold a hearing on April 26 to determine if subscriber billing would be possible in Horry County. Laurens representatives will attend, as this may directly impact on the situation here.

City Attorney Saunders introduced Gary L. Williams, a new associate in his office.

Mr. Henderson asked about the Sheppard vs. City lawsuit. Mr. Saunders said that the rules had changed and that he was waiting on the remittitur. He further stated that once we start the election schedule, it is possible that plaintiffs in the other suit will want to enjoin.

Mr. Robertson asked if it was time for the Building Inspector to report. Ms. Thomas said that was put off until the next meeting due to a change in Councilmembers.

Ms. Miller asked about the status of Sullivan Street, which will be re-surfaced by the state. Some changes in plans are needed.
