At the regular monthly meeting March 12th. 1957 of the Commissioners of Public Works of The City of Laurens a resolution was passed approving a "Combined Utilities Commission for the City of Laurens, S. C.", whereby the electric, water, sewerage and natural gas utilities are to be combined.


This action was taken after Mayor Joe B. Medlock explained that City Council had approved this combined Utilities Commission, and that the City Attorney had drawn up a proposed Act to be submitted to the Laurens County Delegation, and which was in the form of an amendment to the Act setting up such a Combined Utilities Commission for the City of Greenwood, S. C.

This action was taken with the understanding that such Combined Utilities Commission would supersede the present Commissioners of Public Works of the City of Laurens, and that the present Commissioners would automatically become members, for their present terms of office, of this new Combined Utilities Commission.

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A BILL

To amend Section 1, Act No. 216, approved April 29th, 1955, entitled "An Act To Amend Section 59-179, Code Of Laws Of South Carolina, 1952, Relating To The Powers Of Boards Of Commissioners Of Public Works Of Cities And Towns, So As To Further Provide Certain Powers For The Board Of Commissioners Of Public Works Of The City of Greenwood" so as to include the City of Laurens within its provisions.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF SOUTH CAROLINA:

Section 1. Amend Section 1 of an Act No. 216 entitled "An Act To Amend Section 59-179, Code Of Laws Of South Carolina, 1952, Relating To The Powers Of Boards Of Commissioners Of Public Works Of Cities and Towns, So As To Further Provide Certain Powers For the Board Of Commissioners Of Public Works Of the City of Greenwood" by inserting between the word "Greenwood" and the word "may" on line 2 of Section 1 the words "and the City of Laurens", so that said section when so amended shall read as follows:

"Provided, however, that the Board of Commissioners of Public Works of the City of Greenwood and the City of Laurens may purchase, build or contract for building any waterworks, electric system, gas system and/or sanitary sewerage system, and all appurtenances and parts of such systems, authorized under Article 6 of this chapter, and may operate them and shall have full and exclusive control and management of them. Such board may supply and furnish such facilities and may require payment of such rates, tolls and charges as it may establish for the use of any such utilities."

Section 2. All acts or parts of acts inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 3. This act shall take effect upon its approval by the Governor.

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RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING APPLICATION
FOR FEDERAL GRANT FOR SEWAGE TREATMENT
WORKS BY THE CITY OF LAURENS

WHEREAS, the sewage disposal for the City of Laurens is inadequate and constitutes a health hazard, and the City can pay for a portion of the cost of a new plant from utility revenues, and has authorized a General Revenue Bond Issue for such purpose, and

WHEREAS, the total cost will be so great as to be a hardship to accomplish at this time, but Federal funds can be obtained to assist in such construction,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAURENS, SOUTH CAROLINA:

That application be made to the Department of Health, Education and Welfare of the Public Health Service through the State Water Pollution Control Agency for a grant in the sum of \$219,750.00 for assistance in the construction of sewage treatment facilities for the City of Laurens, and such application shall be on Form PHS-2654 with such appendices as may be necessary,

And, the Mayor of the City of Laurens is hereby authorized to execute and file said application on behalf of the said City of Laurens.
